## **NYS Council of School Superintendents hosts Winter Institute: “The Heart of Educational Leadership: Kids First in Every Decision”**

**Albany** –Meeting at the New York State Council of School Superintendents’ Winter Institute on January 10-11, 2010, approximately 300 school leaders from across New York state will discuss the changing dynamics in state government, the current and future fiscal challenges facing the state and how these issues impact superintendents and the delivery of public education to New York’s schoolchildren.

THE COUNCIL, a professional and advocacy organization with 700-plus members that has served the school superintendents of New York state for over a hundred and twenty-five years, will meet at The Desmond Hotel & Conference Center in Albany to explore the theme “*The Heart of Educational Leadership: Kids First in Every Decision.*”

“The conference motto, ‘*Kids First in Every Decision,*’ is both a request and a promise,” explained Council Executive Director Thomas Rogers. “It’s a request to state and federal policymakers that they keep the interests of schoolchildren foremost in their deliberations in the months ahead. But even more important, it is a promise by our members of how they will approach the decisions they confront in leading their school systems – to ask first and always, what would be best for the students they serve.

In addition to opportunities to learn about the implications of the state fiscal outlook for schools, the Winter Institute will provide a legal session that addresses new changes in the coming year that will affect school districts and a discussion on the newly published Snapshot VII survey on the current state and nature of the superintendency.

Keynote speakers will include:

- **Dr. Ronald Heifetz, Senior Lecturer, Harvard University and Founder, Center of Public Leadership**, will present “*Leadership in a (Permanent) Crisis.*” He is recognized for his seminal work on building the capacity of organizations to successfully adapt to change. His latest book, *The Practice of Adaptive Leadership: Tools and Tactics for Changing Your Organization and the World*, was coauthored with Marty Linsky and Alexander Grashow. Dr. Heifetz is a graduate of Columbia University, Harvard Medical School, and the Kennedy School of Government.
- **Vince Poscente, Business Strategist, Olympian and Best-Selling Author**, will share his ideas with “*Age of Speed,*” a presentation on why harnessing the power of speed is the ultimate solution for those seeking less stress, less busyness and more balance. With insights from his best-selling book, *The Age of Speed*, and his experiences as an Olympic athlete and Fortune 500 consultant, he has developed an invigorating perspective on getting results fast.

- Also, participants can attend the closing session with **Commissioner of Education David M. Steiner** to hear and discuss the major issues confronting public education in the state. Commissioner Steiner will speak at the **Monday, 3 p.m. session**.
- Council Executive Director Thomas Rogers will provide final thoughts and comments to the Winter Institute.
