Supporting and Sustaining Instructional Leadership: Roles and Responsibilities of the Principal and Superintendent



The Leadership for Educational Achievement Foundation (LEAF, Inc.) in collaboration with Monroe #1/#2-Orleans BOCES is pleased to present a series of professional development workshops designed to assist superintendents in their efforts to support the ongoing development of school principals in their role as instructional leaders. No one can discount the formidable impact that teachers and principals have on student learning and achievement. A strong and growing body of research supports this connection and it has become quite clear that highly effective principals do the “right things” to get positive results.

The State’s new APPR for principals centers on the continual development of principals as instructional leaders with the knowledge and skill to get the “right things” done the “right way.” Part of the equation for success in the development of principals as instructional leaders is support, encouragement and guidance from superintendents.

This workshop series will focus on what the research tells us about the knowledge bases and skill sets that define “instructional leadership” and how these findings can best be applied in the real world of school improvement. The relationship between the principal and superintendent will also be explored with attention given to roles, responsibilities and practices that support the ongoing development of instructional leadership. Participants will be provided with tools, skill building exercises, case studies, simulations and information to build on their current strengths as leaders. Each workshop session has been designed to be practical and applicable to the real world of the principal and the superintendent in today’s high stakes age of accountability.

Additionally, all workshops will address some of the required training elements for lead evaluators under the Commissioner’s Regulations (CR 100.2: Training and Certification of Lead Evaluators).

Sessions can best be described as “hands on” as well as “minds on” with participants taking an active role through discussions, simulations and reflection. Teams of superintendents and principals (along with other district leaders involved in the APPR process for principals) are invited to attend.

Regional sites have been established in order to provide a statewide opportunity for participation. With grant funding, we are able to keep the cost reasonable for participants in recognition of local budget constraints. BOCES aid is also available.
